In honor of volunteers in all parts of the world

NAMA Center, one of Oatar Foundation for Social Work's (OFSW) affiliated Centers, has participated in the 2017 International Volunteer Day celebrations, in the framework of its ongoing encouragement of voluntary work and the promotion of community participation, while reaffirming the importance of volunteering as a noble humanitarian value, and the need to support volunteers in their pivotal role in achieving comprehensive development in their communities.

NAMA Center is regarded as one of the most prominent social institutions contributing to the promotion of a culture of volunteerism in Qatar.The Center's first voluntary work forum was launched in 1998 and was organized by the Center's volunteers, to encourage individuals and institutions to contribute to volunteerism and instill the meaning and value of voluntary work in the hearts of citizens and residents. In 1999, the Volunteer Award was launched and has been celebrated annually ever since on the International Volunteer Day, which falls on the December 5 each year. The Volunteer Award aims to promote a culture of giving and nurture the voluntary and humanitarian efforts of individuals, groups, and institutions, in recognition and honor of their work, in addition to raising awareness of the role of volunteering in the development of society and motivating individuals and institutions to nurture it. In the framework of the development and the diversification of its categories, the Center issued in 2003 a circular for the award that was officially announced on June 29, 2004. The Center also conducted studies on volunteer work that included studying obstacles to volunteering for Qatari women, as well as establishing workshops covering all segments of society, such as students, journalists and professionals, in the field of social work, in order to develop mechanisms for the implementation of the objectives of the

Among the most prominent projects that won the prize was the project of the charitable unit for kidney dialysis at NAMA Center, the Charity Vouchers project, a Qatar Red Crescent project, and a Qatar Diabetes Association project.

This was followed up with the launch of the National Campaign to Promote Volunteerism (KAFU) in 2009, as a result of the relentless efforts to develop and promote a culture of voluntary work. The award was preceded by a four-month volunteer awareness campaign. targeting schools in particular, in addition to targeting other locations where youth gather such as universities, shopping malls and sports clubs. The philosophy of the campaign was based on two fundamental principles: appreciation of outstanding volunteer work, and the stimulation of every effort that enriches volunteerism and ensures its continuity.







One of the most significant achievements in partnership with civil society organizations in the country is the Qatar Volunteers Network (TAMM) initiative, which is an interactive platform for volunteers that the Center seeks to develop in the coming period.

Continuing its efforts to expand volunteerism and involve the largest possible number of youth in its various activities, the strategic directions of the Center 2017-2022 included an integrated strategy to promote youth participation in community service and to allow them to develop and interact within the Center's project for the development of social entrepreneurs. The project is implemented through two channels: the 'Moqbeleen' project, which was launched to introduce the center's project and attract young people to join capacity building programs to enhance the contribution of youth to civil work and social development; and the 'Sama Nama' project, which takes place through multiple stages to develop the capabilities of social entrepreneurs and enable them to design social projects that the Center provides technical and financial support for. The project outcome includes the development of current and potential youth leaders, current and potential, and encouraging them to be active and participate in achieving a better future, and a life full of vitality giving, and contentedness.

Through its 'Mogbeleen' project, the Center also seeks to communicate with various community events, especially for youth, to raise awareness about the activities, projects, and developmental services offered by the Center.

This is to improve the individual's status, qualify them, and support them technically, financially and logistically, so they can jumpstart their careers and achieve economic independence and social stability, towards contributing to the achievement of Qatar National Vision 2030, which is centered on knowledge-based sustainable economic development.

NAMA Center is currently working on a plan for 2018 for the 'Mogbeleen' project, the main pillars of which include organizing various events and activities aimed at attracting more young volunteers to contribute to strengthening society and serving their country.

in the World Day of Remembrance for Road **Accident Victims**



General Directorate of Traffic, National Committee for Traffic Safety, Hamad Medical Corporation, Transportation Studies Centre at Qatar University and Public Relations Department observed on Sunday, November 19, 2017, at the General Directorate of Traffic in Madina Khalifa the World Day of Remembrance for Road Accident Victims (WDR), with the theme: Towards UN 2020 Target: Reduce road fatalities and serious injuries by 50%. The WDR is commemorated on the third Sunday of November each year to remember all those who have been killed or injured in road accidents.

Addressing the gathering, Brigadier Mohammed Saad Al-Kharji, Director General of the General Directorate of Traffic said that we commemorate the International Day of Remembrance for Road Accident Victims by recalling the tragedy of the victims of accidents and evaluating the efforts of the police, ambulance and civil defense in traffic safety and as a reminder of the big losses of accidents.

He pointed to the United Nations plan to strengthen the efforts in this framework, which has been ratified by all countries and called "Plan of Decade 2011-2020", which invites all countries to reduce the number of deaths by 50% by 2020.

Regarding the role of the health sector, post-incident response and the reduction of fatalities and serious injuries on the road. Sheikh Dr. Mohammed Bin Hamad Al-Thani, Director of the Public Health Department at the Ministry of Public Health said that it was important to remember that road accidents kill an estimated 12,500 people worldwide each year, in addition to 50 million different injuries causing continuous disability for victims. The injuries resulting from traffic accidents are the the main cause of death among people between the ages of 15 and 29 years.

He added that the Ministry of Public Health is concerned with responding after road accidents to save the injured drivers, passengers and pedestrians, and reduce the number of serious injuries and its complications. "Among the initiatives adopted are improving communication services for the ambulance service, providing more than 1,450 ambulance personnel answering thousands of calls. This has led to make the telephone response time about five seconds, and the arrival time to the scene seven minutes inside Doha, and eight minutes outside".

Lt. Col. Mohammad Radhi Al Hajri, Director of Media and Traffic Awareness Department at the General Directorate of Traffic, spoke about the objectives of spreading traffic awareness among the different types of the communities.













Dr. Kim Greo, Director of the National Traffic Safety Office, discussed Qatar's vision for traffic safety and the requirements of the United Nations Plan for the Decade 2011-2020, and the efforts of the State of Qatar to support and improve traffic safety. He noted that there are three challenges faced by the rich, poor, and developed or developing countries - Traffic Safety; Cities and Congestion; Economy and National Security - and that these challenges can only be met through successful safety plans.

Concluding the event, Brigadier Al-Kharji, Director General of the General Directorate of Traffic, honored a number of the participants in the celebration including Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad Al Thani, Sheikh Dr. Hassan bin Ali Al Thani, Mrs. Mariam Al Mannai, Mr. Talib Afifah, Mr. Ahmed Al Shahrani, One of the accident victims, Mr. Rashid Al-Humaidi, one of the accident victims.

On the sidelines of the activities, an awareness exhibition was held with the participation of a number of authorities concerned with road safety, to educate the public on road safety procedures.

NAMA Center organized an arbitration and evaluation session for the first generation projects of the 'Sama Nama' program

The NAMA Center, one of Qatar Foundation for Social Work (QFSW) affiliated Centers, as part of its follow-up to the first generation projects of the 'Sama Nama' program, organized an arbitration and evaluation session for the projects participating in the program. The committee was composed of selected influential personalities in society and social and technical experts. The session was attended by officials, directors, section heads, and a number of media professionals, and the results will be announced during the first generation graduation ceremony of the 'Sama Nama'.

The 'Sama Nama' program was launched during World Youth Day events targeting young people of both sexes in the age group 18-35 years. The project started in September 2017 and included specialized courses to enable participants to acquire intellectual knowledge and creative and operational capacity in social leadership to innovate and implement projects that serve the community.

The program took 10 weeks, and was implemented in a number of stages, starting from September 5, 2017. The first phase began with a theoretical learning course that included lectures, symposiums and other varied activities in Qatar for one week, which helped to identify the concept of social leadership and the building of their personalities as social pioneers. It was followed by the practical phase in the United Kingdom for a week, aimed at providing participants with opportunities to approach global experiences in the field of social

The third and final stage events for capacity-building lasted for eight weeks, from October to December 2017, where participants worked collectively and interactively to work on the delivery of implementable community projects.
